

SUSAN B. ANTHONY WAS BORN IN 1820. SHE GREW UP IN ADAMS, MASSACHUSETTS. SHE HAD THREE SISTERS AND TWO BROTHERS. EACH CHILD HAD CHORES TO DO EVERYDAY. THE GIRLS DID THE INDOOR CHORES, LIKE IRONING, COOKING AND SEWING. THE BOYS HELPED OUTDOORS, WITH CUTTING WOOD AND REPAIRING THE BARN.



BUT BOYS CAN IRON AND COOK TOO ... AND GIRLS CAN CHOP WOOD IF THEY WANT!



WHEN SHE WAS OLD ENOUGH, SUSAN GOT A JOB TEACHING. THIS WAS ONE OF THE FEW JOBS A WOMAN WAS ALLOWED TO DO AT THIS TIME. SUSAN DISCOVERED THE MALE TEACHER THAT HAD THE SAME RESPONSIBILITIES, WAS PAID \$10 PER WEEK, HOWEVER SUSAN WAS ONLY PAID \$2.50 PER WEEK!

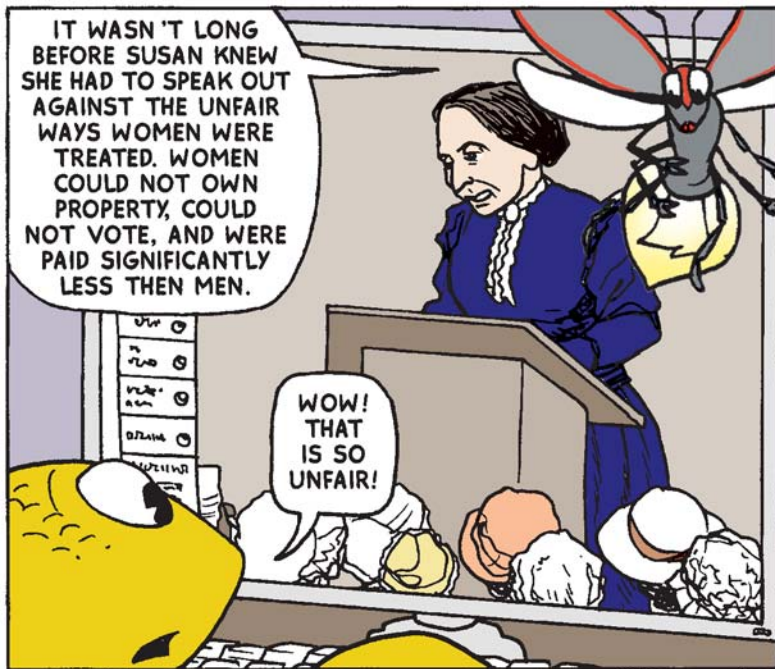
THAT'S NOT FAIR! SHE WAS DOING THE SAME JOB HE WAS!

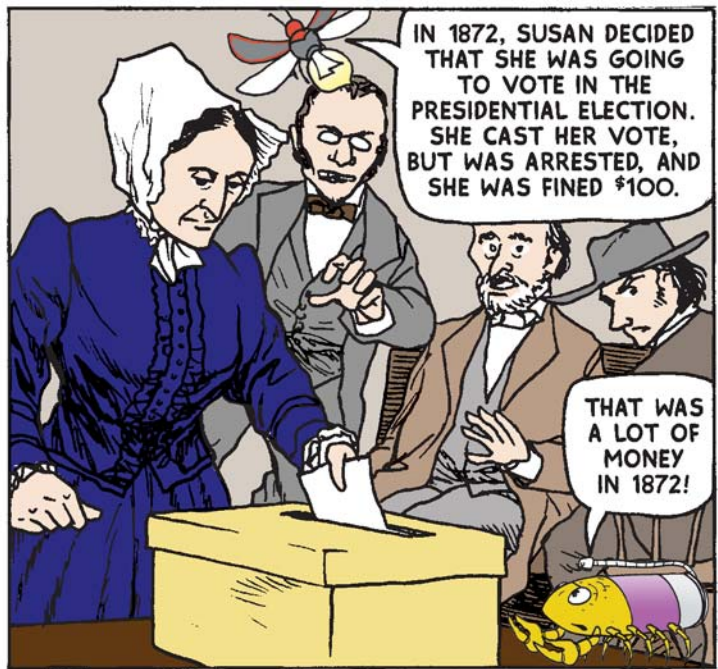


THOSE ARE IMPORTANT QUALITIES IN A LEADER.



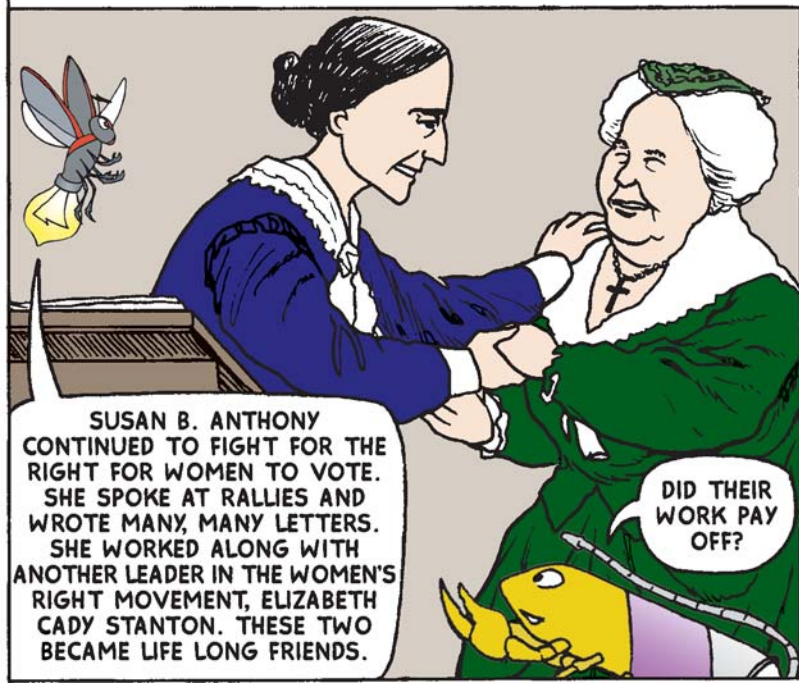

THAT IS SO UNFAIR!



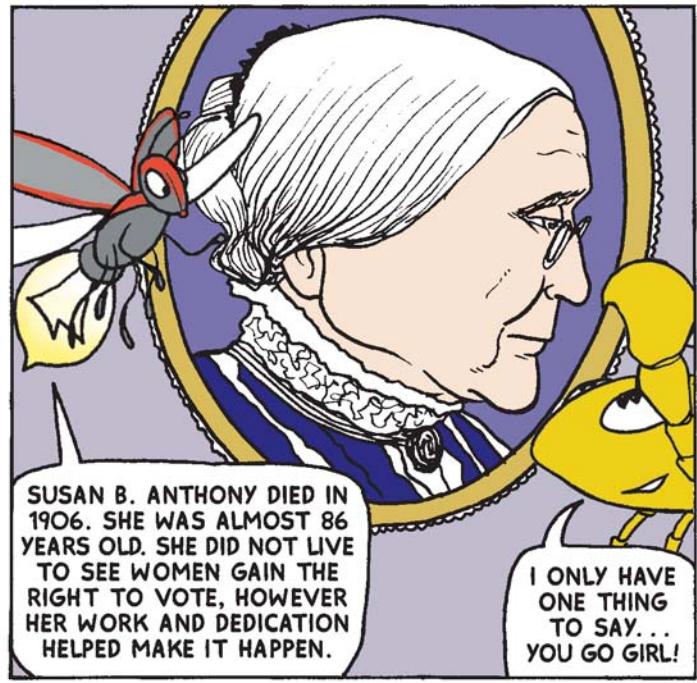
IN 1872, SUSAN DECIDED THAT SHE WAS GOING TO VOTE IN THE PRESIDENTIAL ELECTION. SHE CAST HER VOTE, BUT WAS ARRESTED, AND SHE WAS FINED \$100.

SUSAN B. ANTHONY CONTINUED TO FIGHT FOR THE RIGHT FOR WOMEN TO VOTE. SHE SPOKE AT RALLIES AND WROTE MANY, MANY LETTERS. SHE WORKED ALONG WITH ANOTHER LEADER IN THE WOMEN'S RIGHT MOVEMENT, ELIZABETH CADY STANTON. THESE TWO BECAME LIFE LONG FRIENDS.

DID THEIR WORK PAY OFF?



SUSAN B. ANTHONY DIED IN 1906. SHE WAS ALMOST 86 YEARS OLD. SHE DID NOT LIVE TO SEE WOMEN GAIN THE RIGHT TO VOTE, HOWEVER HER WORK AND DEDICATION HELPED MAKE IT HAPPEN.

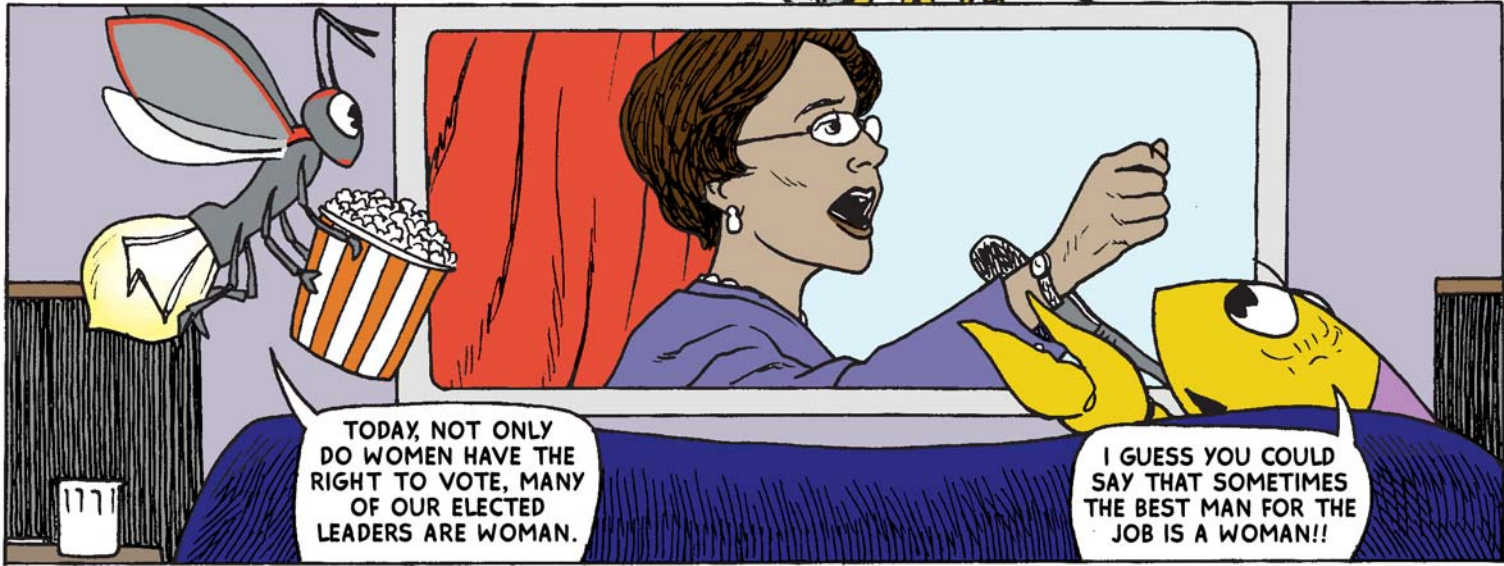
I ONLY HAVE ONE THING TO SAY... YOU GO GIRL!
